



## Key School & Student Attendance Information

*Save this for your reference - pin it on your fridge!*

- School begins promptly at **8:00 am**

### COVID GUIDANCE

***If your child tested positive for COVID, please notify your school site immediately. The office will inform you of appropriate next steps.***

**For all anticipated extended absence (5-14 days) , inquire at the school office for Short-Term Independent Study 1-2 weeks before the first day of absence.**

If your student is very sick, keep them at home. Refer to the graphic below to check when and when not to send your child to school.

It is recommended to call the doctor if the student continues to be sick for more than two days. If visiting the doctor, it is good practice to get a doctor's note and bring it to the school when your student returns.

## WHEN IS SICK TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?



#### Send me to school if...

I have a runny nose or just a little cough, but no other symptoms.

I haven't taken any fever reducing medicine for 24 hours, and I haven't had a fever during that time.

I haven't thrown up or had any diarrhea for 24 hours.



#### Keep me at home if...

I have a temperature higher than 100 degrees even after taking medicine.

I'm throwing up or have diarrhea.

My eyes are pink and crusty.



#### Call the doctor if...

I have a temperature higher than 100 degrees for more than two days.

I've been throwing up or have diarrhea for more than two days.

I've had the sniffles for more than a week, and they aren't getting better.

I still have asthma symptoms after using my asthma medicine (and call 911 if I'm having trouble breathing after using an inhaler).

Schools remain open unless Alameda County of Education declares otherwise.

*Here are tips for getting to school:*

1. Plan for extra time getting to school. Leave home early!
2. Prep your raincoats, umbrellas & rain boots.
